

Will Germany become a Third World country?

To compensate for the tremendous loss of energy, many wind turbines and solar power plants are planned and realized near the North Sea coast. Politicians of the Green Party are howling that these plans are too late for the Earth to survive.

But the power from wind and sun in Germany is only 10% for solar and 25% for wind.

Because of the Covid-19-Pandemic, we are now into the next lockdown. Shops are closed, but this cannot be the solution for the future: open shops, then close shops, because of an increase of infections.

People are losing their jobs or are on short hours, shops and companies are closing because they are insolvent.

The car industry is down in Germany, engineering also and there are fewer pupils choosing the MINT subjects at school (maths, computer science, science, and technology. It's the STEM education). ***On the other hand, gender studies are booming.***

The Lefts, Greens and Socialists are forcing a new spelling of German words: **gender-sensitive spelling**, because none of the minimum three genders (he, she and diverse or binary) should be discriminated.

Next development that makes me a bit scared is to be called a Nazi or right-wing extremist if you are not always in agreement with government decisions.

If you are for example asking about the positive aspects of the economy because of the political decisions of the lockdown, it's better not to express it in public.

No one is allowed to question the decisions of the government. Neither the sitting members of the political parties nor the inhabitants.

The one who rules and decides is only the chancellor and the prime ministers of the 16 federal states of Germany (and they are always nodding the chancellor's decisions). Even if the decisions are wrong, as graded by a scientist.

Mr. Vahrenholt for example does not exist in public discussions. Everyone who is discussing the decided activities for the climate (it is of course a climate collapse that'll destroy the whole country) or economy or education, is muzzled.

Another item, that must be discussed is digitalization in Germany.

The public are trying to be homeschooled, because of the possibility of infection. But the programs aren't fully developed. In some schools or federal states of Germany it works, but in many others it's difficult for pupils.

Colleagues are telling me, the programs aren't rationally divided, and the kids have to search for the lessons and tasks. In the summer month the government is on holiday and absent...the government promised in spring to deal with all that problem, But in October they reacted as if the pandemic is something unknown (even in Germany we have to deal with it since February).

Many departments or offices in Germany (health department, tax office, municipal office) are working with fax machines and letters. The ones with digital equipment aren't working with consistent reporting software. The departments and offices aren't connected.

This is not helpful during the pandemic because the number of infected people is listed too late or multiple times. No one knows the real number of infected persons. And infected people cannot be informed immediately...

An application (Corona Warn App) has been developed for about 70 Million Euro...but it doesn't work or only with problems. And it can only be used on smart- or iPhones of a newer generation. Sometimes I look with jealousy to countries that are up to date ;-)

This is my view on what is happening at the moment. People are losing or have lost their jobs if they comment this way. D
